Sarah Groh, the chief of staff to Representative Ayanna S. Pressley, Democrat of Massachusetts, <u>told The Boston Globe</u> on Wednesday that when Ms. Groh tried to push the panic buttons in the Capitol, she discovered that all of the ones in Ms. Pressley's office had been inexplicably "torn out."

Representative Jamaal Bowman, Democrat of New York, <u>tweeted</u> on Wednesday that his office also did not have panic buttons during the assault. And Democratic members of Congress on Wednesday accused unnamed Republicans of <u>giving tours</u> of the Capitol before the violent siege.

"Those members of Congress who had groups coming through the Capitol that I saw on Jan. 5, a reconnaissance for the next day, those members of Congress that incited this violent crowd," said Representative Mikie Sherrill, Democrat of New Jersey, "I'm going to see that they're held accountable."
