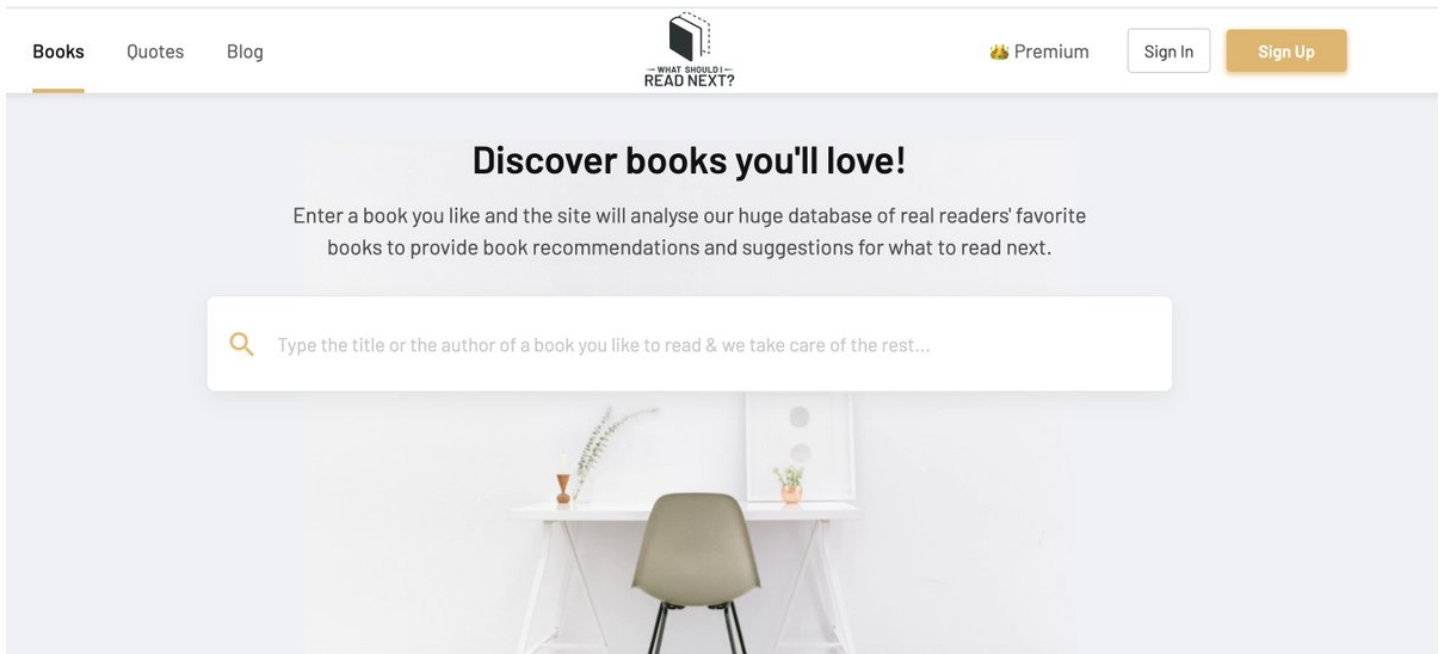

This site helps you find your next amazing book.

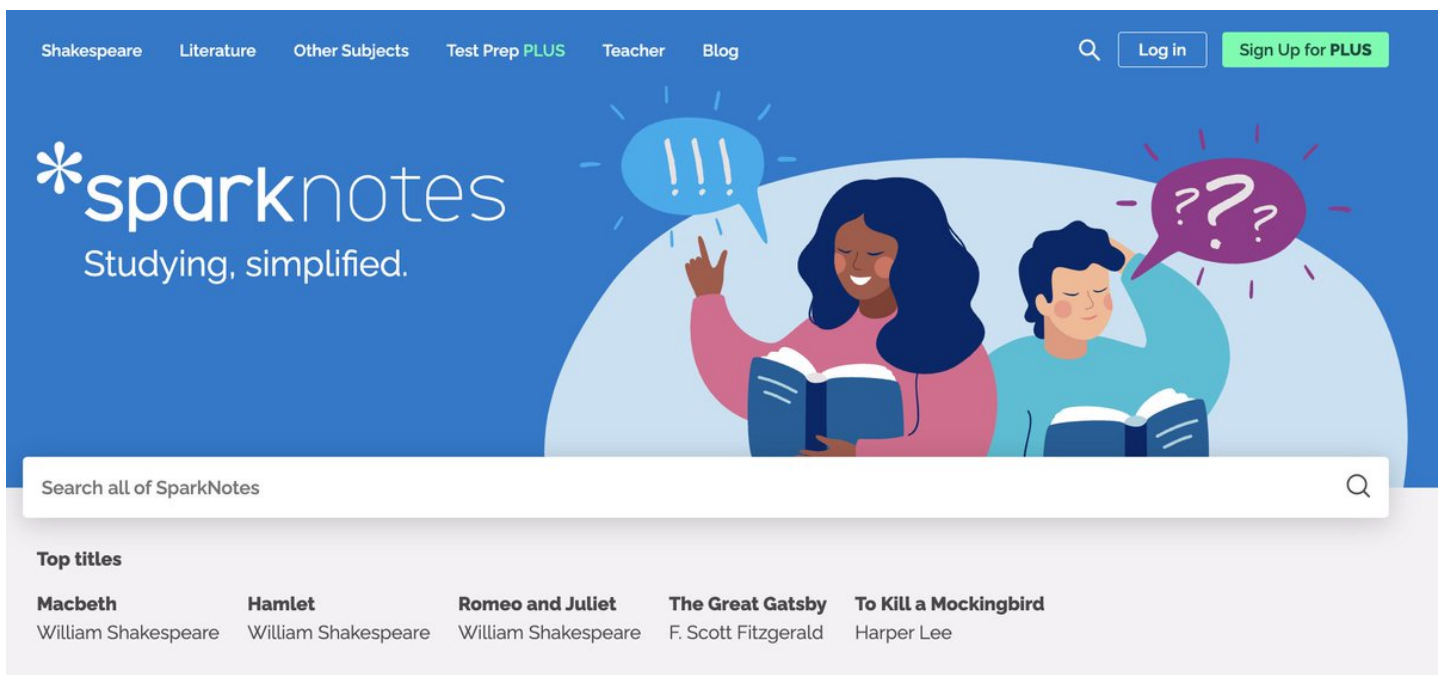

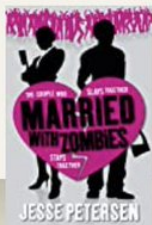
