1. Al Text Classifier

The Open AI team created a tool to identify AI-generated content.

It's not perfect yet. But the longer text you paste the more likely it is to be sure.

New AI classifier for indicating AI-written text


We're launching a classifier trained to distinguish between AI-written and human-written text.

2. Originality .ai

If you hire writers or have an agency on retainer claiming they write original content it doesn't hurt to check once in a while.

This is a simple tool that lets you check the originality of a piece.



3. CopyScape .com

The free version allows you to enter one of your URL's to be checked for plagiarism.

4. GPTzero .me

Just paste the text you want to have checked and GPTZero will analyze it within seconds and tell you if it was Al-generated or not.



5. ContentAtScale. ai

This works similarly to GPTZero. Just copy and paste some content and let them do their magic.

Within seconds you'll know whether your content is real or Al-generated.
