1. AI Text Classifier

The Open AI team created a tool to identify AI-generated content.

It's not perfect yet. But the longer text you paste the more likely it is to be sure.

# New AI classifier for indicating AI-written text

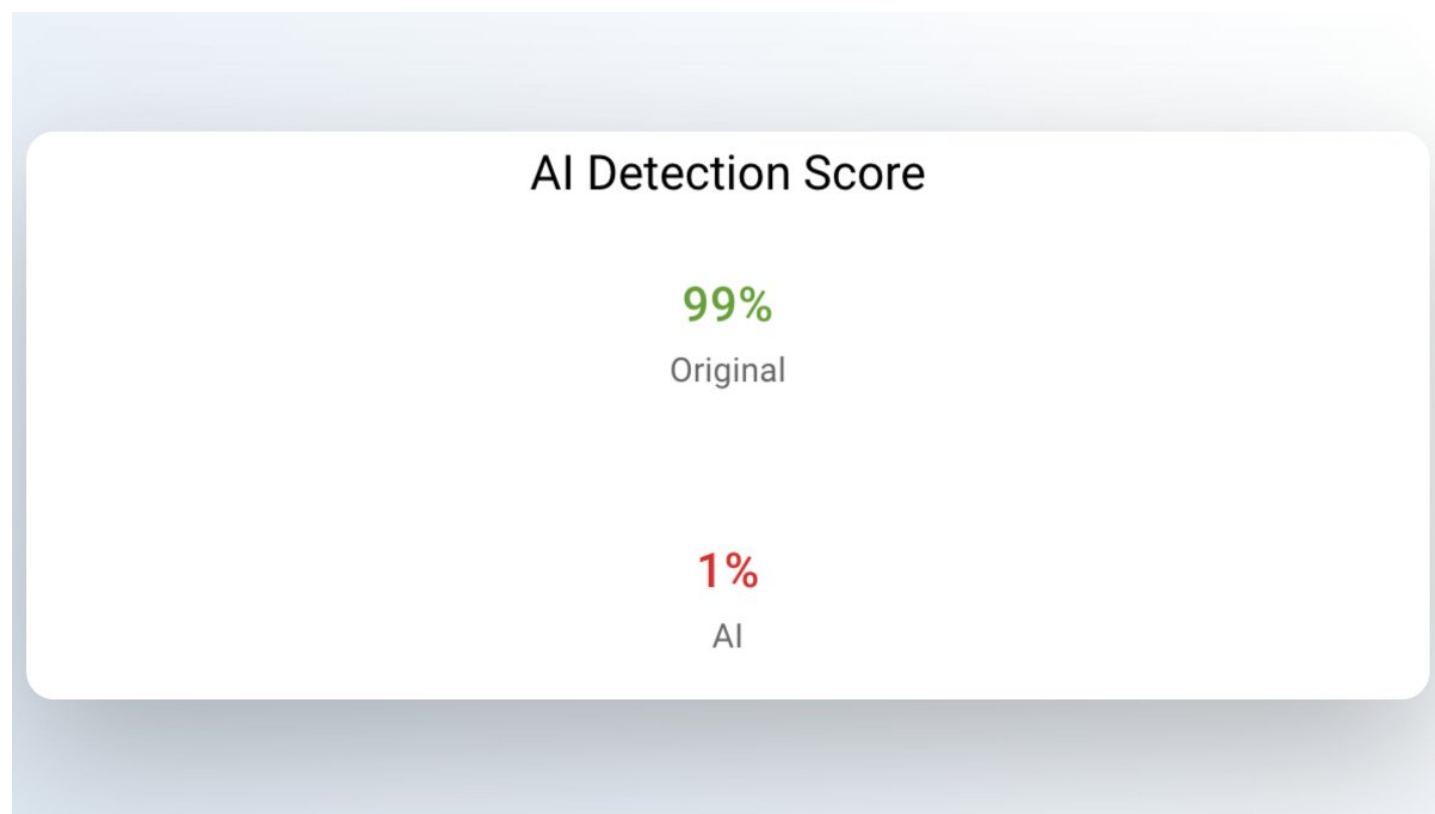
We're launching a classifier trained to distinguish between AI-written and human-written text.

## 2. Originality .ai

If you hire writers or have an agency on retainer claiming they write original content it doesn't hurt to check once in a while.

This is a simple tool that lets you check the originality of a piece.

## 3. CopyScape .com

The free version allows you to enter one of your URL's to be checked for plagiarism.

#### 4. GPTzero .me

Just paste the text you want to have checked and GPTZero will analyze it within seconds and tell you if it was AI-generated or not.

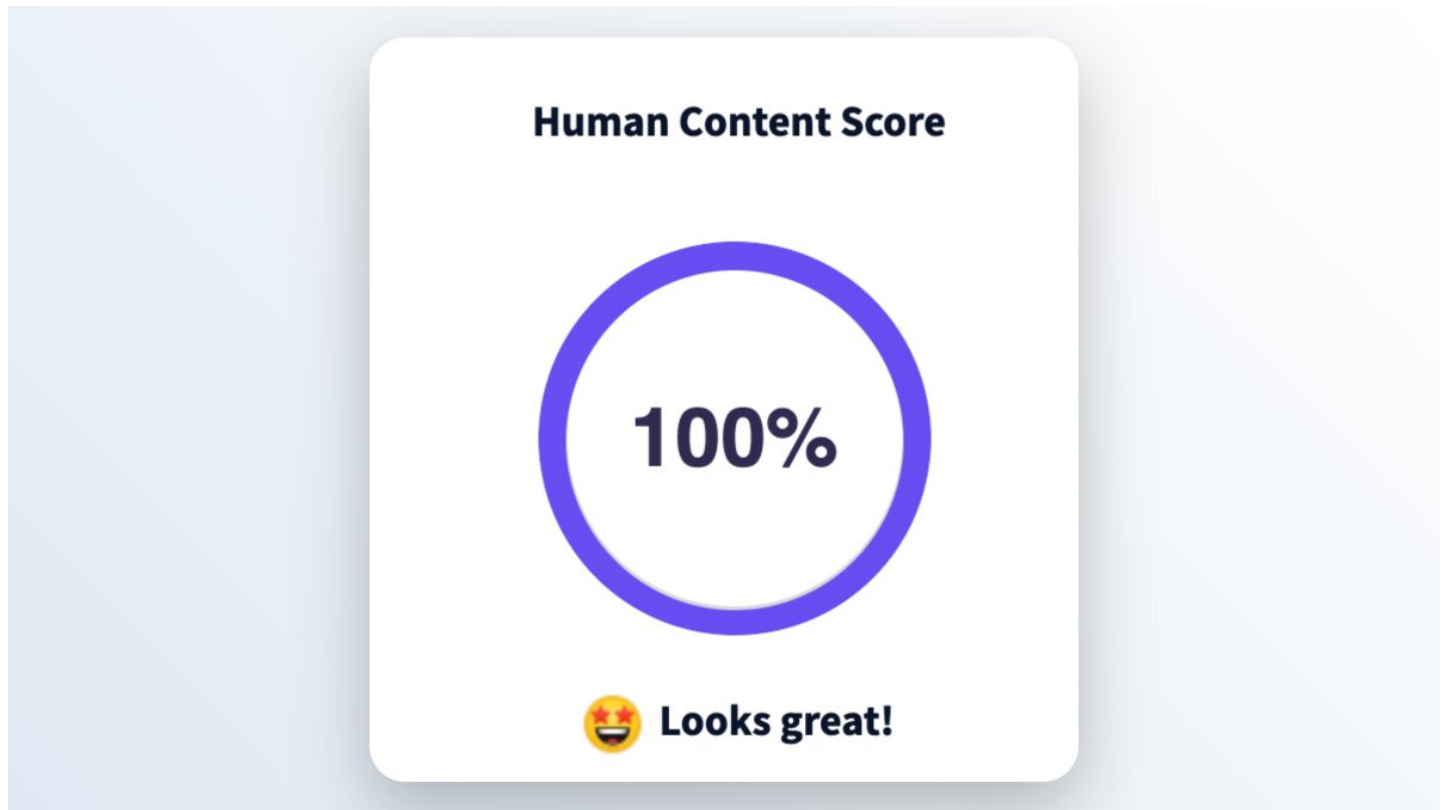

Within seconds you'll know whether your content is real or AI-generated.
