7/10 Environment: occuba recommends 460,000 ha of #trees planted by 2035 and restoration of #peatlands. Effective planning will be key to unlocking the multiple co-benefits. We recommend Local Environment Improvement Plans to encourage a joined-up approach



8/10 Climate Justice: @theCCCuk highlights that transition must be just. As planners we need to embed #climatejustice in decision making, supporting vulnerable communities https://t.co/lwjxsEVEZu
