Hi Amanda and team,

Here is a quick update regarding where we are at with reusable masks:

- **Bob Dale Masks:** (local company)
 - distribution to be done through verified suppliers (Vallen, Granger)
 - Bob Dale has provided cost support for us through these vendors, awaiting pricing from both.
 - Turnaround times for 1 million units can be up to 3 months, however BD runs these plans, so that timeline can be expedited.
 - Samples are at my computer (with our spacers if need be) **logo on the mask can be removed**
 - Bob Dale is willing to partner with us and provide donations of these to Education
- **Old Navy/GAP:** (US/Canada based)
 - for larger volumes we are dealing with their b2b department, which is US based.
 - per mask which includes shipping
 - Currently awaiting approval for their b2b department to ship these into Canada (they primarily deal with US based customers)
 - Turnaround time from the factory would be 7-9 days
 - Awaiting samples
- **Ennis Fabrics:** (local company)
 - This company sells their fabrics to other manufacturers for the purpose of making masks.
 - They are in the process of working with those suppliers to put together a proposal **multiple suppliers for this deal could get messy**
 - Awaiting information on price and delivery
 - Samples required
- **Unbelts:** (local company)
 - Quick turnaround times (awaiting confirmation)
 - products made to spec according to Health Canada non-medical standards (Spec sheet available)
 - Awaiting a call back to confirm pricing and delivery
 - Samples required

As discussed, below is the information and approvals from Education based on a meeting they had with the Minister and Dr. Hinshaw last Friday regarding re-usable masks.

The decision was to proceed with IFR (as a local manufacturer) and Old Navy for a total mask purchase of 1.692M (an additional 32,000 was added verbally this morning). Approx cost breakdown is as follows:

Dear Commissioner Thibault:

As you might have seen, the Government recently announced the contracting of two vendors to provide 1.7 million re-usable masks for students and as part of the return to e.L2, clause 10.1.1.

The first vendor is the well known vendor Old Navy, which has recently begun mass-producing masks for the pandemic. The second vendor, IFR Worldwide, has elicited some few controversy that I nevertheless wish to flag to you proactively.

Founded in 2005, IFR is a well-established manufacturer of workwear that happens to be based in my constituency of Red Deer-North. In addition, both IFR as a corporate entity and its CEO Reg Radford have made political donations to political parties/campaigns in the past.

The vast majority of the donations are to the former PC Party, between 2008 and 2015. However, Radford did donate \$2,000 to my local election campaign in 2019 (Appendix A). While the Radford family is very well known in the Red Deer community, myself and my family do not have any personal connections to them or their company.

Nevertheless, I would like to assure you that neither myself nor my political staff had any role in the selection of vendors for these masks.

Due to urgent time constraints, my Department utilized the Provincial Operations Centre (POC) to procure the masks in question. The POC operates under the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

My office was only made aware of the winning vendors the morning of Saturday, Aug. 8, prior to the issuance of a statement reassuring the public that the mask procurement was well in hand (Appendix B).

As Minister of Education, my only concern on this matter is getting masks that meet the requirements into the hands of parents in time for the start of classes in a matter of weeks.

Given tight deadlines, it is my understanding that the POC directly contacted vendors which it believed capable of meeting the technical requirements and volume of a very large order - 1.7 million re-usable masks - in just weeks. Non-political staff at the POC alone made the final selection of vendors.

I have also attached a letter from my colleague Minister Maize, better explaining this process, as the POC falls under his ministry (Appendix C).

I hope this letter assures you that there is nothing untoward in the selection of vendors for this project.

Lyn Radford, IFR's spokesperson and wife of owner Reg Radford, lied to the Edmonton Journal that they got the contract through a "third party distributor".

Lyn Radford, spokeswoman for IFR workwear, said in a Tuesday interview the family-owned company got the contract through a third-party distributor, and doesn't communicate with end-customers during the procurement process.
