Let's do an unboxing of Generations Selects Cordon and Autobot Spin-Out, featuring Sunstreaker

Inside, we have Spin-Out and Cordon, held in place by two plastic tags. The box is basic and standard Selects packaging, so nothing really new, but it's the 2nd Selects two pack we've had, the first being Shattered Glass Optimus Prime and Ratchet, and I'm really enjoying the

two-packs. I hope they do more of them.

And here they are!

In hand they feel very tight, but the good kind. They're a bit plain deco wise. It's in keeping with their original diacolor designs, so you cannot complain. And I feel having them both released together in one set

helped with that, as I think it would be harder to sell them both if they were released individually. They just don't have the same presence that other diacolor counterparts such as Tigertrack, Exhaust or the upcoming Deep Cover have. They're a bit generic, plain even, which is

why releasing both in a two pack worked well. Sunstreaker just exudes personality, the others don't, although Cordon gives off more introverted vibes, which goes well with Sunstreaker.

And Spin-Out, well he just exists. That's all I'm really to say on him.

Maybe I'm just missing

something. He did start his life as a mech after all. That's pretty much what his whole tfwiki bio is about. He was a mecha for humans, he was turned into a cybertronian, and he's loyal to humans. That's pretty much it. And in Of Masters and Mayhem he was a cook. Who died.

A cool thing these do is they can transform. Unfortunately the instructions that detail their transformations mixed up their names. They just can't catch a break, can they.

Vehicle mode and they look great. Spin-Out turns into a red sports car that I wish Sideswipe did also, and Cordon turns into a patrol car. It's not entirely clear what type of emergency car he is as there's no markings, but I'm going with a general police patrol car.

They're very nice. I don't feel like Cordon's roof fits in as it should. I think that's excess plastic, but could just be to do with the mold. Sunstreaker does the same thing. The car modes are nice, but they don't do anything groundbreakingly new. It's Sunstreaker but red and

white.

That's all there really is to say. Cordon is quite nice and Spin-Out just sort of exists. Maybe he'll grow on me, who knows.

Overall, I think it's a good set. While I'm not too impressed by Spin-Out, I know others will want him. And two figures in one box is always good.

And I very much feel that buying multiple of this set will go nicely towards a Machinations display. It's a good set, and as it's two relatively obscure diacolor characters, you can't exactly go wrong with it.
