<u>@DamalieOwori</u> <u>@OWC_ug</u> OO: What do we do to transform from agriculture to other fields? We have 68% of Ugandans outside the market economy. We have laid the foundation with universal education, health, operation wealth creation, then peace & tranquility.



<u>@DamalieOwori</u> <u>@OWC_ug</u> GEN SALIM SALEH: What is causing the anxiety in the public is the disconnect between MRM in Government, and NRM O, the organization.



<u>@DamalieOwori</u> <u>@OWC_ug</u> GEN SALIM SALEH: There are some conspiracy theories & security threats people are not discussing. There is one on the internet that all the wealth has been taken by the Kaguta family. They say we have finished all the land in the country!



<u>@DamalieOwori</u> <u>@OWC_ug</u> GEN DAVID MUHOOZI: We need to enforce the law firmly. Whatever ambitions we have need a stable space if we are to achieve our dreams. We have invested in prevention.. that explains our presence on the streets, to assure that all is safe.
